The Office of Student Judicial Affairs (SJA) partners with many offices on campus to encourage students to be knowledgeable about the University's policies and the possible consequences.

The Office of Student Judicial Affairs believes that the most successful students are those who inform themselves of the university's policies and resources for prevention. SJA is dedicated to the level of student support that is necessary to learn skills in citizenship, responsibility, and true membership of an academic community.

SJA attends, hosts, and participates in university events to educate students, e.g., Orientation, Ethics Bowl, National Hazing Prevention Week, Homecoming, health fairs, Roadrunner Days, and many others.

Outreach and student support from SJA is offered in several ways:

- Faculty may request SJA presentations to a class ranging in topics from scholastic dishonesty and classroom behavior, to alcohol and other drugs.
- Students, staff, and faculty can call or visit our office with their specific concerns and questions. Our door is open.
- All university community members can pick up information that is helpful in addressing a friend/classmate that they might be concerned about from our office or at campus events.

About Student Judicial Affairs

UTSA’s Office of Student Judicial Affairs (SJA) addresses student behavior and academic conduct on-campus and in some cases, off campus. This is accomplished by informing and guiding students toward personal responsibility, academic success, and citizenship.

SJA strives to have a fair, educational, and objective process. As part of this process, SJA seeks to provide opportunities for students to understand their own role in the community as a whole at UTSA and respect the community that transcends our boundaries.

Our door is open and you are always welcome to seek assistance from our office about the SJA process, and consultations regarding scholastic dishonesty, assaults, alcohol, drugs, or other concerns that arise on campus.

The SJA Office includes an Assistant Dean/Director, two Assistant Directors, a Coordinator and an Administrative Associate who are all available to assist you.

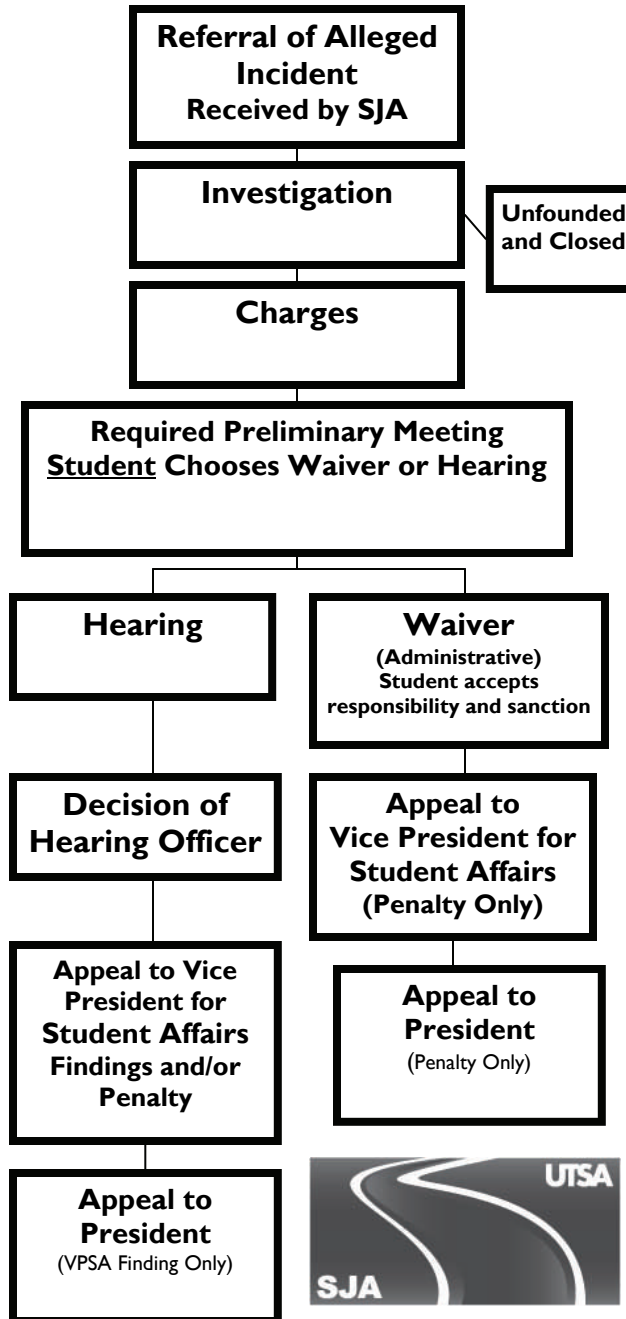
Student Rights

UTSA students are provided the following procedural rights during the student judicial process:

- Right to know what behavior may be in violation of the Student Code of Conduct.
- Right to have a support person with them during the hearing.
- Right to have a preliminary meeting where they can tell their version of the events in question.
- Right to choose a hearing or a waiver to resolve the violation.
- Right to appeal.

Roadrunner Responsibilities

Being a student at UTSA is a privilege that is garnered through succeeding at academics and meeting the expectations of behavior that the University has proscribed in the Student Code of Conduct. This responsibility should not be taken lightly. Read the Student Code of Conduct and feel free to contact SJA with any questions.

As a student, you are responsible for your actions on and off campus. Section 201 of the Student Code of Conduct states:

“A student is expected and required to obey federal, state, and local laws, to comply with the Regents’ Rules and Regulations, with University rules and regulations, with directives issued by an administrative official of the System or the University in the course of his or her authorized duties, and to observe standards of conduct appropriate for an educational institution.”

Definitions

Student—a person who is currently enrolled at the University, is accepted for admission or readmission to the University, has been enrolled three prior semesters and is eligible to continue enrollment, or is attending an additional program sponsored by the University.

SCC—The Student Code of Conduct applies to individual students, prescribes the standards of conduct expected of students enrolled at the University, outlines actions that can be taken when conduct is not in conformity with the prescribed standards, and establishes due process procedures for the imposition of such actions.
