## **Leadership Report: Academic Affairs**

### PROVOST KIMBERLY ESPY & SENIOR VICE PROVOST OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS HEATHER SHIPLEY

- UTSA welcomed the most diverse cohort of tenured/tenured track faculty members in its history during 2021-2022 academic year.
- The number of undergraduate degrees awarded has increased and the average time to degree has decreased.
- The number of degrees conferred annually to Hispanic students has increased steadily over the past decade
- First, second, third year retention rates have increased.
- The six-year graduation rate has increased.
- Online/Master's/Doctoral Program Enrollment
  - Over the past five years we have seen a 14% increase in the number of masters enrollment and a 29% increase in doctoral enrollment.
  - Over the past five years we have seen an 8% increase in the number of masters degrees awarded and a flat rate in doctoral degrees.
- SSA operational planning is moving forward. Dean Martinez is leading the COLFA phase 2 visioning.
- COVID-19 protocols: Testing program has been extended.
- Whataburger Resource Room: important wellbeing support program for UTSA students.

#### **Critical Incident Response Planning Overview**

Maintaining an environment that supports teaching, learning and discovery will require a thoughtfully coordinated approach. Other Critical Incident Scenario protocols which faculty may encounter are currently under development, and will be shared when complete.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

If someone is causing a disruption in your classroom, ask them to leave and consult with your department chair on the situation. Don't hesitate to reach out to the BIT or other campus resources.

### Are there different protocols for different scenarios?

Yes, there are different protocols specific to each scenario. Some are similar but other may have different resources. Some scenarios may not initially require UTSA police presence. Educating the community to the specific protocols will help address the situation correctly.

#### What does it mean to monitor social media?

We don't use any data analytical tools, but we monitor for comments that UTSA is tagged on and respond appropriately.

Graduate School Initiatives Updates: Phase 2 Implementation of Graduate Student Success Task Force Task Force Report available here.

Recommendations:

- Graduate Assistantships: Establish uniform definitions around GA categories with defined rights and responsibilities and uniform appointment processes and appointment letter templates.
- Define funding packages for doctoral students to ensure fairness, integrity & transparency.
- Recruitment & Enrollment: VIP and Keep Running With Us programs have netted very high quality students. 75% of students admitted through these programs are Hispanic or African American.
- Graduate Programs, Processes, and Faculty
- Value Added Programming

GSA (Graduate Service Assistant) - a new proposed category for individuals with expertise in a service area who can then be appointed to a Graduate Assistantship aligned with their expertise (i.e. a student in a counseling program working in an office that deals with counseling, they can be appointed as a GSA using their expertise.

NOTE: If students are hired on grants which do not follow the semester, or if international students are coming in late because of various visa reasons, etc. they can be appointed later.

### Q&A

There are concerns regarding the differences between salaried Graduate Research Assistants (GRA) vs GRA on stipends/fellowships. Students with fellowships do not have access to the same resources because they are not "employees".

Dean Mathur and Dr. Espy are working with Business Affairs to ensure students are not penalized for being successful.
