

ATTENTION FRESHMEN!

Will the new 6-Drop Limit affect you?

- New Legislation (SB 1231) limits the number of classes a student may drop in their college career to six.
- This applies to all students who are first-time freshmen in Fall 2007 or later.
- Courses dropped at any public institution of higher education **will** count toward the limit.
- Courses dropped prior to the census date (12th class day) **will not** count toward the limit.
- Courses dropped for the purpose of withdrawing for the semester **will not** count toward the limit.
- All UTSA students will receive an email to their official UTSA email account, whenever they drop a class, noting that they have dropped a class, and how many drops they have left.
- Once a student has dropped three classes, they will begin receiving a letter when they drop a class. This letter will include information on the appeal process, should a student believe they have good cause for dropping more than six classes in their college career.
- UTSA is still in the process of adopting policies and procedures to implement the appeal for good cause.
