

- \$2.45 billion annual economic impact on metro Atlanta




Georgia State University Enrollment

Georgia State University Under-represented Minority Enrollment by Ethnicity



Percent of Full-time, First-time Degree-seeking Undergraduates who were awarded Title IV Federal Student Aid by Income Level














Georgia State University Headcount by Tenure Status




Georgia State University Percent of Faculty by Tenure Status




Georgia State University Under-represented Minority (URM) Faculty




Georgia State University Under-represented Minority Faculty by Tenure Status



Georgia State University Faculty by Gender




Georgia State University Female Faculty by Tenure Status



Georgia State University Student-to-Faculty Ratio





Georgia State University Staff by Ethnicity




Georgia State University Staff by Gender





Georgia State University Total Research Expenditures




Georgia State University Federally Financed Research Expenditures






Georgia State University Total Revenue per FTE Student




Georgia State University Tuition and fees per FTE Student




Georgia State University State Appropriations per FTE Student



Georgia State University Expense Type as a Percent of Core Expenses




Georgia State University Administrative Cost as a Percent of Instructional Cost
