An opening reception will be held on Thursday, October 5 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the gallery which is located at the Blue Star Arts Complex. The exhibit will run through October 22

Among the exhibited works are many examples that indicate how traditional printmaking techniques have influenced contemporary art.
