**UTSA TO HOST LOCAL FILMMAKER WILLIAM MOLINA
FOR SCREENING OF ‘TRUTH BE TOLLED’**

(SAN ANTONIO) - The UTSA Graduate Political Science Association will host independent filmmaker William Molina for a screening of his documentary “Truth Be Told” from 7 to 10 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 18 in the 1604 Campus Main Building, room 0.106. The event is free and open to UTSA students, faculty, staff and area residents.

The film focuses on the Texas Department of Transportation’s plans to convert existing Texas roadways into tollways, as well as the proposed Trans-Texas Corridor project. Molina decided to tackle the hot button issue after he felt it was not being adequately addressed by politicians and the media.

The one hour and 45 minute documentary, a four-month project for the veteran filmmaker, was compiled from more than 40 hours of footage from public toll road meetings held in San Antonio and surrounding areas.

The film features interviews with anti-toll road organizations and addresses recently-passed state tolling laws. Molina notes that while his film makes a political statement, it was not funded by any politician or political organization.

Molina spent more than 15 years directing and developing movies and television shows for the Discovery and History channels and currently lives in Los Angeles and San Antonio.
