

Trinity University holds a luncheon with the Ruth McLean Bowman Bowers Lecture and you are invited to join in on the festivities. We are looking to bring together members of the San Antonio and University communities to discuss important concerns facing women today.

The 2010 Ruth McLean Bowman Bowers Lecture features Helen Zia, an award-winning journalist and former executive editor of Ms. Magazine. A second generation Chinese American, Helen Zia has been outspoken on issues ranging from civil rights and peace to women's rights. Zia is a lesbian activist who married her partner during the gay weddings in San Francisco during 2004, and again in 2008 when the California Supreme Court ruled that all same-sex couples are entitled to marriage equality. She is a Fulbright Scholar and serves on the board of directors of the Women's Media Center, which was founded by Gloria Steinem, Jane Fonda and Robin Morgan. Zia is a member of Princeton's Class of 1973, the first coeducational class. Her lecture is titled Gender, Women, and Empowerment.

The lecture and luncheon will be on Monday, March **22 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.** in the Chapman Great Hall. Seats are \$20 for community members. Seating is limited.
