


Fall 2021 Enrollment Milestones


STUDENT SUCCESS Undergraduate Degrees Awarded & Time to Degree





The Kudla Fellows program is a prestigious and competitive graduate fellowship program established through the generosity of UTSA alumni Frank, '85 and Nancy Kudla, MBA '87 through their Kudla Family Foundation. The program supports graduate student research and education in cyber security.





END OF YEAR GIVING

CARES Act Tax Incentives Extended through December 31st

An expansion of the universal charitable deduction for cash gifts. The deduction is \$300 above-the-line deduction for single filers and \$600 for married couples filing jointly for cash gifts to charity.

An extension of the cap on deductions for cash contributions.

For those who itemize deductions, Congress raised the limitation from 60% of AGI to 100% for gifts of cash. Taxpayers who want to make the most of this temporary increased deduction limit may find it makes sense to "bunch" donations planned for multiple years into the 2021 tax year. (For corporations, the law raised the annual limit from 10% to 25% of taxable income.)



- NSA Texas


The largest National Security Agency hub outside of Washington, D.C.

 Many other Department of Defense, national security and cybersecurity agencies (DOE, USSS, FBI, CIA, etc.)

- **2,725 defense contractors** in Bexar County
- In 2019, \$3.9B in defense contract and \$4.1B in defense personnel spending in Bexar County
- New Cybersecurity Manufacturing Innovation Institute
 Department of Defense investing \$111M from 2020-2025
- UTSA has 4 campuses with new buildings underway in this ecosystem

Fueling the Ecosystem

UTSA is engaging government, industry and academia to tackle the nation's greatest cybersecurity threats.

UTSA's expanded Downtown Campus will **fuel synergies between federal agencies and San Antonio's technology and manufacturing sectors.** Potential collaborations with Texas agencies, such as the Department of Information Resources, will enhance the impact.

- New School of Data Science (SDS) will house:
 - National Security Collaboration Center
 - DOE's Cybersecurity Manufacturing Innovation Institute
- New Innovation, Entrepreneurship & Careers Building (expansion of the Alvarez College of Business) will be next to the SDS





COST AND CONSTRUCTION DETAIL

Total Cost: \$161,250,000

Funding: Principally by TRBs, but also potentially with philanthropy, institutional and U.T. System funds

Key Milestones: Assuming funding approval in November 2021

- October 2021 Begin Programming and Concept Design
- August 2022 Design Development Approval
- September 2022 Notice to Proceed
- March 2025 Substantial Completion
- Fall 2025 Occupancy

- Tailored executive education and new collaborative degree programs in business, engineering and the sciences
- Career-engagement opportunities for students to develop marketable skills and meet the city's pressing workforce needs as part of UTSA's Classroom to Career Program
- Expanded downtown footprint to support the programs of the Alvarez College of Business and UTSA's goal of increasing enrollment to 45,000 students by 2028. The building will directly address the university's classroom and lab space shortages, presently estimated by the THECB to be 1.6M square feet.
- Urban-serving focus bridging UTSA's research and academic assets with community innovation, entrepreneurial leadership and business development.


