GREGG MICHEL, PH.D.
FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

- **Designated by the institution to serve as a liaison between the institution and the athletics department.**
- **Member of the faculty and appointed by the president.**
- **Representative of the institution in Conference and NCAA affairs.**

Role of the FAR is to:

- **Ensure that the academic institution establishes and maintains the appropriate balance between academics and intercollegiate athletics.**
- **Ensure academic integrity of the athletics program**
- **Ensure personal well-being of student-athletes**
- **Promote institutional control of intercollegiate athletics by monitoring and assessing rules compliance**
- **Enhance the student-athlete experience**

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS COUNCIL

- **Advises UTSA President on all matters of policy and procedures for Intercollegiate Athletics program**
- **Meets at least three times each academic semester**
- **FAR serves as the Chair**

- **Cost: \$35 million**
- **Breaking Ground: Early 2025**

- **3,000-square-foot weight room with dedicated cardio**
- **1,000-square-foot athletic training room for sports medicine**
