The purpose of the newsletter is to communicate updates from the Faculty Senate and to encourage faculty participation in the spirit of shared governance and the success of UTSA students, faculty, and staff.

CHAIR'S REPORT: Alexis Godet

- An update was provided on the progress of key priorities for the current academic year. The two main priorities—administrator evaluations and the strategic compensation plan—were addressed during a recent presentation by the Provost, which clarified all outstanding questions.
 - Follow-up on these matters is planned for 2025.
- In preparation for Dr. JoAnn Browning's presentation to the Senate in spring 2025, faculty members are encouraged to gather and submit questions from their department faculty. This input will help ensure comprehensive coverage of all relevant concerns.
 - Questions should be submitted to Dr. Godet by January 10, 2025.
- At the Senate's second spring meeting, Carlos Martinez, Senior Vice President for Institutional Strategic Planning, Compliance Risk Management, and Chief of Staff for Office Operations will present and address the Texas Legislative session.



Leadership Update Heather Shipley, Ph.D., Provost & Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs

- Provost Shipley provided an update on the <u>Enhancing Wellbeing initiative</u>. UTSA has several resources available for students, faculty and staff. Student resources include Wellness 360 Counseling Services, Timely Care, and the Crisis Help Line.
- Student listening sessions that began during the Day of Reflection concluded the first week of December, while faculty and staff sessions are scheduled for spring 2025. A task force will evaluate feedback from all sessions and deliver formal recommendations by March 2025.

- The formal evaluation process for deans and department chairs was outlined. Deans undergo evaluation in the spring after completing three years of service. The provost makes a recommendation to the President based on: the evaluation criteria in the Handbook of Operations Procedures and a survey from the Office of Institutional Research (IR) that assesses the dean's strengths and areas for growth. The results are reviewed with the dean, who then has an opportunity to address both strengths and concerns in a college meeting. Following the provost's recommendation, the university President makes the final reappointment decision.
- The evaluation process and criteria for department chairs/school directors remain largely the same, with two key differences: Institutional Research (IR) distributes the survey, and the dean shares the results. Like the dean review process, department chairs have an opportunity to address the results during a department chair meeting.



What is being done to address student concerns about wait-time for counseling services?

• We are actively monitoring and evaluating our services through a dedicated taskforce to optimize accessibility and minimize wait times for all students.

How can we improve the student user experience to provide more direct human interaction rather than relying on automated responses?

• This will be discussed in the next task force meeting.

In the evaluation process, are all types of data weighted equally, or are some types given more importance than others?

• No, all data is considered equally and plays a vital role in making a comprehensive decision.

How is confidentiality maintained in feedback submissions?

• All feedback submissions are aggregated before being shared with leadership to ensure confidentiality. Individual responses cannot be traced back to specific respondents unless they choose to identify themselves.

What is the rationale behind the merit decisions?

 While we achieved record enrollment this year, our budget operates on a two-year cycle. The current budget, including the one-time payment, was established two years ago. We'll learn about our next two-year budget during the upcoming legislative session.

Will UTSA executives and administrators receive a salary increase instead of merit this year?

• No, merit increases will be applied equally to all faculty and staff this year.

Will summer courses be included in this year's budget?

 The Provost has met with college leaders and Deans to maintain summer teaching levels. Rather than reducing courses, they are exploring opportunities to add more sections in certain colleges. Course offerings will be adjusted based on student needs.



Budget Committee Mary Dixson, *Chair*

- Dr. Mary Dixson confirmed that merit allocations are consistent across campus. She verified this information with Sheri Hardison, Vice President for Financial Affairs and Chief Financial Officer, who will present to the Senate in January 2025. This schedule gives Senate members time to prepare their questions.

What is the typical relationship between promotions and salary adjustments in higher education institutions? Are salary increases automatically included with promotions?

• Promotions may include salary increases, but they are not guaranteed. For more detailed information, it is better to discuss it with Sheri Hardison.
