CHAIR'S REPORT: Alexis Godet

- A recap was provided on the brand socialization listening session held on February 27.
- A call was made for two representatives to serve on the Organizing Committee for the upcoming UT System Research Symposium.
 - The Research Committee managed the nomination process.
 - Questions or expressions of interest can be directed to the Research Committee chairs.
- An opportunity was announced to contribute to the HOP revision related to FTT titles.
 - The Faculty Senate is asked to nominate one representative.
- It was noted that:
 - The April Faculty Senate meeting will be held virtually.
 - The May meeting will be held in person.



Leadership Update Heather Shipley, Ph.D., Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs

- Dr. Shipley presented the same town hall presentation that she gave to all colleges and academic support divisions.
- Topics included the integration with UT Health San Antonio, the 89th legislative session, state and national advocacy efforts, federal matters, current fiscal year budget and preparation for the FY26 budget.

Question and answer

Regarding SB37, how will faculty representation in the Senate change under the proposed structure?

• The proposal is still under review. The current draft suggests a modified selection process where each college would have two representatives: one appointed by the president and one elected by faculty.

What is the university doing to address the grant freezes that are affecting faculty and students? What grants have been canceled?

• Currently, 16 grants are paused and 3 DOD-related grants have been canceled. We are evaluating various scenarios and models to help us adjust as needed.

Has UTSA's designation as a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI) changed?

• No, UTSA continues to hold its federal designation as a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI), and that status remains unchanged.

What is the purpose of One Riverwalk Place?

• One Riverwalk Place will serve as a future home for the School of Architecture and Planning. The building also includes existing tenants whose presence contributes to generating revenue for the university.

One of the strategic investments was related to retaining employees - what are the strategies for that?

The staff compensation study is ongoing. Beyond that, People Excellence is leading the faculty and staff
wellbeing initiative for the benefit of all employees. Through Faculty Success and other offices, we will
continue to expand on all these initiatives and implement recommendations.

How can the Faculty Senate support ongoing university efforts?

• When information is requested by the UT System, the university collaborates with academic leadership, subject-matter experts, and the Government Relations Office to provide informed responses. Continued engagement and communication from the Faculty Senate help support these efforts.



Follow up on proposed position statement

- The Faculty Senate held a follow-up discussion on a previously shared statement, with updated copies provided during the meeting.
 - Members discussed the statement and potential next steps.
- A motion was approved to have the AFEM Committee explore possible actions moving forward, with plans to include input from those involved in drafting the original statement.
