All students must meet the criteria below to qualify as a Pre-Business (PRB) student at UTSA:

- Have successfully completed evaluation under the Texas Success Initiative (TSI)
- Completed MATH 1325 or be eligible for enrollment in MAT 1033 at UTSA (Algebra with Calculus for Business or a higher level mathematics course)
- Completed ENGL 1301 or be eligible for enrollment in WRC 1013 at UTSA (Freshman Composition I or higher)

Transfer students are required to complete 12 business hours at UTSA before they can declare BBA major. See UTSA catalog for complete details.

### Things to do and remember upon Admission to UTSA:
