Special College Admission Requirements:

All students must complete the following courses with a C- or better to be considered for admission to the BBA Programs of the College of Business at UTSA:

MATH 1325, ENGL 1301, ECON 2301, and ECON 2302

Admission to the Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) majors in the College of Business is competitive and based upon academic performance. Students must first qualify as a pre-business student and complete a series of courses before they can be evaluated for admittance to the College of Business and declare a business major. The size of the newly admitted class is decided by the College each semester and is determined by the available enrollment capacity, and the size and quality of the application pool. Therefore, admission to the UTSA College of Business is not guaranteed.

To be considered for admission to the College of Business a pre-business student must complete 7 required courses (21 credit hours) of which 5 are business courses with a minimum of C- or better. In the semester that a pre-Business student completes the five required business courses (15 hours) at UTSA, he/she will be evaluated for admission to the College of Business. This is known as the 15-hour rule which requires that by the time students complete their 15th business hour, they must have taken the required two nonbusiness courses and the required five business courses from List 1. If any of the required business courses have been completed prior to entering UTSA, students must take additional business courses at UTSA from List 2 in order to meet the 15-hour rule. Students who earn 15 business hours without completing List 1 forfeit their chance to be evaluated for admission to the College of Business and they must choose another major outside of business. For detailed information regarding qualifying as pre-business, admission requirements and to view List 1 and List 2 courses see the undergraduate catalog.

Things to do and remember upon Admission to UTSA:

- Make an appointment with the academic advisor of the major once accepted to UTSA to clarify department, college and university policies and procedures, to review course sequencing and to help with identifying resources for academic success.
