You need a permit to park on campus

Valid permits or hourly payment are **required** to park in surface spaces and parking garages.

Hourly parking

Park at an hourly rate in garages or select surface spaces. Save time parking in garages by using a FastPass.

2

Park only where your permit allows

Check the back of your permit for valid spaces and park up options according to your permit type.

Park up options

Many surface permit holders can park in additional spaces from 4:30 p.m. – 6 a.m. on weekdays and all day weekends.

Make sure your permit is visible

Hang your permit from the rearview mirror and place in front of sun visors.

Can't hang your permit?

Visit Campus Services for a free permit pocket that adheres to your windshield.

4

Allow time to commute and park

Give yourself time to commute to campus and park. On-campus traffic is heaviest from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m.

5

Students, ride The Runner to class

Students can save time by parking in the East Campus lots or Brackenridge lots 4 & 5, then riding The Runner to and from the heart of campus.

6

Exchange your permit at any time

Considering a garage permit after buying a surface permit, or vice versa? Visit a garage cashier window to upgrade or downgrade your permit type.
