Regardless of your choice to report, support measures are available in the following areas:

- Advocacy accompaniment to meetings
- Prevention education consult
- Survivor support 1-on-1 consult with bystanders
- Relocation of housing assignment
- Class schedule changes
- Work schedule changes
- Transportation assistance
- Excused absences or substitute assignments
- Safety escorts around campus
- University issued No Contact orders
- Referrals to counseling and/or health services
- Assistance with VISA and immigration info
- Assistance with financial aid info
- Referrals to legal services

According to state reporting requirements, all responsible employees are required to report incidents of sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking allegedly committed by or against a student or employee to the EOS/Title IX office.
