CERAMICS CLASSES

<u>Studio Classes</u>: Students that are currently registered for an in-person studio class will be allowed limited open studio access prior to the start of their class and immediately following the end of their class. Additional open studio may be available; please check with your instructor. Students should have good hand strength and coordination and be able to lift 25lbs.

<u>Tools and Supplies</u>: An apron and towel are recommended. Tuition for all ceramic courses covers glaze materials and kiln firing and one 25-lb bag of clay: however, students should anticipate additional fees for extra clay, specialty underglazes, dusk mask, and some tools unless otherwise noted. Supplies will be discussed at the first class. Clay (\$25 for a 25 lb bag) can be purchased online and picked up with proof of receipt during class sessions. A basic tool kit (\$20) is also available for purchase during class sessions. Clay, glazes, and tools may be purchased from <u>Roadrunner Ceramics</u>, Jerry's Art Arama, or other online retailers listed on the last page. Please bring only the basic ceramic tools and supplies you need for class into the studio.



Basic ceramic tools suggested for both Wheelthrowing and Handbuilding classes. The kit shown is available for purchase from the ceramic department or can be purchased locally at Jerry's Art Arama or Roadrunner Ceramics or online.

Below are the recommended clays used per class. **NOTE:** Students wishing to work in a different clay body must first discuss options with their instructor; students will be limited to which outside clays are allowed in the studio, and it must be clay body appropriate to the firing temperature that your class will be glaze firing at.

Students will need to download a free source app to their phone or tablet (iOS or Android compatible)

• **Capture Device**: Digital Camera / photo recording device for taking stop-motion photos. It needs to be fully charged and able to take photos and have either Bluetooth or a USB cable.

Can be one of the following: Smartphone: Android, Smartphone: iPhone, Tablet (iPad, Kindle, etc.), Digital camera (DSLR camera, etc.) If using a camera, will still need a device to plug into for using the app.

<u>HueHD USB digital camera</u> or <u>Hue HD Pro version</u> (has a longer neck than the standard version, built-in light, and built-in microphone) Note: the Hue animation software that comes with the camera isn't supported by newer Operating Systems; however, because it comes on a gooseneck stand, the USB camera won't need a tripod and can support overhead shooting.

- **Camera Stabilization:** In order to achieve an animated effect, it is important to keep the camera still while shooting. This support must allow for overhead shooting. Can be one of the following: Tripod for camera device, Camera stand, Use Hue camera with built-in stand (*see above*)
- **Software / Apps:** <u>Stop Motion Studio</u> (free version suffices; you can also upgrade to Pro version for \$9.99)
- Accessories: Computer Headphones / Earbuds
