4101 | Bookbinding Basics

Keri Miki-Lani Schroeder | All Levels

Students will make a variety of book structures using traditional and contemporary bookbinding techniques. This class will cover how to use bookbinding tools and equipment for making handbound books with a focus on craft and structure, as well an overview of materials and resources. Students will make a variety of book structures from traditional hardcover books to innovative sculptural forms. *Includes some materials, see website for a list of items needed for class.*

We will look at a select Artist's Books, discuss content development and creative writing methods, and experiment with sculptural and movable book structures and materials. This course allows students, of all levels of experience, time to work on guided or independent projects. Basic papermaking instruction will be covered for the beginner or as needed, as well as fiber preparation, pigmenting pulp, forming techniques, and more. Students may make paper to print or draw on, as well as use pulp to paint with, or form 3-D shapes around armatures or by casting in moulds. Using three different types of paste, all made in class, students will learn how to apply color to the paste, and use stencils, collage, stamps, and decorating tools. Beginning level students will try various types of printmaking—relief, monotype, collagraph, and etching. Intermediate-level students will have the opportunity to explore more advanced projects in etching, relief, lithography, and collagraph. *A materials list will be provided at the first class*.

Learn the basic elements, or tools, used to create the human figure in an academic procedural approach; that is, a general-to-specific approach, where one element is built upon a previous one (as opposed to a more direct type of drawing where each line is essentially the finished line). Students will explore how to draw the gesture clearly and learn to contain the forms that make up the human body into basic volumes (i.e. spheres, boxes, ellipses and cylinders). Towards the end of the course, students will concentrate on specific landmarks of anatomy and useful facts about the human body, in order to develop a strong systematic approach that frees them creatively, while adding complexity and a new level of believability to their drawings. Students will work from live models and use simple drawing materials. Prerequisite: Previous drawing experience. Model fees are included; please see website for a list of supplies.

In this non-traditional contemporary approach to watercolor painting, students will create work that reflects feelings, experiences, and heavily abstracted symbols drawn from their own personal lives. Students will learn traditional and non-traditional watercolor techniques, as well as fundamental principles of art with an emphasis on compositions, color theory, and supportive creative exploration. Students should be comfortable with the unique nature of watercolor and be willing to let that guide them through visual experiences of self-discovery and self-expression. *Some watercolor experience is preferred, but not required. Investigate the materials and techniques of oil painting as you acquaint yourself with the medium. Emphasis on developing a personal style of painting, as well as working on composition and the principles for completing a well-executed painting will also be covered. Methods of display and installation will also be covered. **Prerequisite:** *Students must have completed a minimum of one introduction to handbuilding or wheelthrowing course. <u>1034</u> | <u>Stacking and Throwing</u> <u>Large Forms</u>

John Bogovich | Intermediate/Advanced

Expand and challenge your throwing skills by creating larger forms demonstrated through two approaches single thrown or multi-pieced forms. Learn how to throw multiple forms that can then stacked or reassembled into one larger form and how to throw large single forms using quick-drying techniques to stabilize the large-scale throwing process. Students who prefer to throw smaller 2-5 lbs of clay can use the stacking method to create a forms measuring 12–24 inches while students capable of throwing 5-10 pounds of clay will be comfortable throwing single forms of that same height. Clay and firings will be high-fire. **Prerequisite:** *Students must have completed two throwing skills courses or be currently proficient throwing at an intermediate level. See *CERAMICS NOTE.*

<u>1075</u> | <u>Handbuilding: Sculptural</u> <u>Forms</u>

Learn to take ideas from concept to three-dimensional form. Handbuilding is the fundamental construction method used to create sculptural ceramic forms. You will undertake a variety of projects that incorporate slab construction, round and flat coil construction, pinch-forming methods, as well as surface texturing. The class will work in low-fire clay and glazes and learn how to use these materials for the purpose of handbuilding and decorating sculptural work. *Tuition covers glaze materials and kiln firing; however, additional fees for clay, specific glazes and some tools should be anticipated. <u>1040</u> | <u>Raku and Other Alternative</u> <u>Firing Techniques</u>

Lyn Woods | Intermediate/Advanced

Open to individuals who throw and/or hand-build, this class will focus on three methods of low temperature alternative firing—American raku, horsehair resist with high contrast, and vapor fuming in a barrel kiln. Burnishing, the making and use of terra sigillata, using oxides and chlorides as colorants, and copper wire for mark making will be covered with a focus on understanding appropriate forms for the different firing techniques and some of the various types of resists. **Prerequisite:** *Students must have had at least one intermediate level throwing or handbuilding class and must be physically able to pull their own work from the kiln using raku tongs. McAllister Ceramics Studio | Ursuline Campus Tuition: \$305 (Members: \$290) | 8 sessions



*CERAMICS NOTE: Students must be able to lift 25lbs of clay. Tuition for all ceramic courses covers glaze materials and kiln firing; however, students should anticipate fees for purchasing additional clay, specialty underglazes, and some tools unless otherwise noted. 25lb bags of clay and introductory tool kits are \$20 each. Clean up sponges are required and \$2 each. Cash or check accepted.

Studio Note: Enrolled ceramic students will be allowed limited open studio access—one (1) hour prior to the start of their class and 1 ½ hours immediately following the end of their class. Limited open studio time for students to practice will be determined at the beginning of the session; times will be discussed in each class. Open studio time is intended for practicing techniques and projects covered in class; no outside work is allowed.

2001 | Introduction to Weaving

Nancy Heneghan | Beginner

Learn the fundamentals of weaving on a four-shaft loom. This foundation class focuses on loom set up, understanding basic weave patterns (plain weave and twill variations), double weave construction and material considerations. Creating sound structure and developing good weaving habits will be emphasized. Reading drafts will also be covered. Each student will have the exclusive use of a floor loom for the semester. A supply list will be provided at the first session. **Note:** This class is a prerequisite to *2002 On-Loom Weaving Studio Projects*.

Included in the workshop is a full take home beginner kit (Hoop, scissors, thread, needle, heat erasing pen, sample of fabric stabilizer and transfer paper) along with an embroidery tips and tricks handout for reference. Indigo is considered "The Blue Gold" of natural dyes. Fermented indigo has been used as a dye for thousands of years. In this workshop, we will create an indigo vat using pre-reduced indigo, a much less time intensive process. We will fold, twist, roll, gather, tie, scrunch or bind the fabric. The fabric will be immersed in the indigo vat, once removed the fabric turns from green to blue. Unbinding the fabrics will reveal truly unique patterns and compositions. *Please see the website for a list of items to bring to class*.
