Duties

• Typical:

- 1. Manages and supervises fabrication staff: determines schedules and work assignments; recruits, trains and counsels fabricators; evaluates performance; develops knowledge and skills.
- 2. Analyzes fabrication projects; consults with subject matter experts; anticipates problems and devises solutions.
- 3. Oversees the maintenance of inventories and equipment. Researches and requests equipment purchases.
- 4. Coordinates with the Director of Production Division on project decisions and timelines.
- 5. Performs departmental administrative tasks: monitors budgets; tracks employee time and reporting; maintains records.
- 6. Represents the department and/or division at committee meetings, workshops and seminars.
- 7. Performs other duties as assigned.

• Periodic:

- 1. Plans and schedules safety workshops.
- 2. Updates staff on newly developed techniques and equipment.
- 3. Participates in fabrication, construction and transportation of exhibits.
- 4. Prioritizes work assignments in the absence of the Division Director.
