• <u>Function</u>: To provide supervisory skills to oversee a police force and police communications division of The University of Texas System.

• <u>Scope</u>: Responsible for the supervision of police and communications personnel.

Duties

• <u>Typical</u>:

- 1. Performs supervisory duties of subordinate police personnel to include disseminating information to shift operations, active investigations, and current criminal activity; checking performance, appearance, and conduct; evaluating subordinates' work; coordinating training needs; managing daily patrol operations; instructs in university police training programs; and prepares, reviews, and writes performance evaluations of personnel.
- 2. Reviews and updates patrol and communications standard operating procedures. Assists in the accreditation process.
- 3. Manages the Police Department Communications Division.
- 4. Investigates circumstances surrounding violations of law and University regulations or policies.
- 5. Performs other duties as assigned.

• Periodic:

- 1. Confers with local law enforcement, court and governmental officials on matters of mutual interest; assists local police agencies in serving warrants on property within the areas under the control and jurisdiction of The University of Texas System.
- 2. Accompanies police officers, guards and communications operators during assignments, reviewing, analyzing, evaluating, and correcting performance of subordinates.

3. Conducts internal investigations and other investigations, as assigned.
