#### **Summary**

• <u>Function</u>: To provide staff assistance and compliance with policies, standards and regulations associated with occupational safety programs. Responsible for assisting the assigned Safety Division in developing safety programs, developing and delivering training programs, conducting job hazard assessments / safety analyses, facilitating workers compensation insurance (WCI) claims and investigative reports, assisting with the return to work (RTW) program, and conducting workplace ergonomic evaluations.

• <u>Scope</u>: Responsible for developing and implementing safety policies / procedures

and program development for occupational safety concerns at all UTSA

campuses, and owned or operated facilities.

#### **Duties**

#### • Typical:

- 1. Assist in the continued development of institutional programs and policies, manuals, and guides related to occupational safety.
- 2. Perform job hazard assessments with client work groups.
- 3. Perform job safety analyses in work areas as directed by supervisor.
- 4. Assist in the management of the return to work (RTW) program for employees injured on the job.
- 5. As directed by supervisor, investigates accidents and prepares reports of code violations along with suggested corrective actions.
- 6. Maintain appropriate records of accidents and safety violations, such as Employer's First Report of Injury, new claims entered, Police Incident Reports, and injury/illness analysis.
- 7. Provide ergonomic assessments and consultation with management and employees as to methods and equipment that may assist in reducing potential on the job injury.
- 8. Train University personnel in safety procedures and methods relating to

- occupational health, and ergonomic safety programs, as directed by supervisor.
- 9. Maintain a high degree of confidentiality with employee record keeping.
- 10. Ensure compliance with all applicable federal, state and local legislation and codes governing occupational health and occupational safety in all phases or work.
- 11. Perform other duties as assigned to include supply and equipment orders.

### • Periodic:

- 1. Surveys and inspects occupational safety conditions as part of routine program management.
- 1. Attend conferences, meetings, and workshops to keep up-to-date on new safety techniques and changes to applicable codes and regulations.
