	recommendations to Library Administration. Prioritize and coordinate
	outsourcing and internal treatment.
5.	Monitor environmental conditions in Special Collections and make
	recommendations for improvement.
6.	Evaluates UTSA preservation conditions and conservation practices.

7.	Provides training to library staff on condition reviews, preservation
	methods, and environmental monitoring.
8.	Reformats various media for preservation.
9.	Monitors and maintains an inventory of equipment and supplies to
