

## Legislative Riders



#### The Bexar County Fostering Educational Success Pilot Program

UTSA is *not* seeking additional appropriations, rather the ability to move unexpended balances from 2022 to 2023.



#### Institute of Texan Cultures (ITC)

Annual Funding Request: \$69,460/year\*

UTSA was made the custodian of ITC after the 1968 World's Fair and is actively engaging with community leaders on a centennial project. Additionally, state support is needed to offset negative impacts of COVID-19 pandemic.

#### Cybersecure Advanced Manufacturing for Texas

Annual Funding Request: \$2,500,000/year

A new initiative addressing cyber threats to advanced technology and manufacturing companies essential to the Texas and San Antonio economy.



#### Texas Demographic Center

Annual Funding Request: \$17,623/year\*

Demand for services is greatest during the state's redistricting efforts and the following year. Senator Joan Huffman also works closely with the State Demographer and UTSA professor, Dr. Lloyd Potter.

<sup>\*</sup> At a minimum, asking for a 5% appropriations cut restoration
