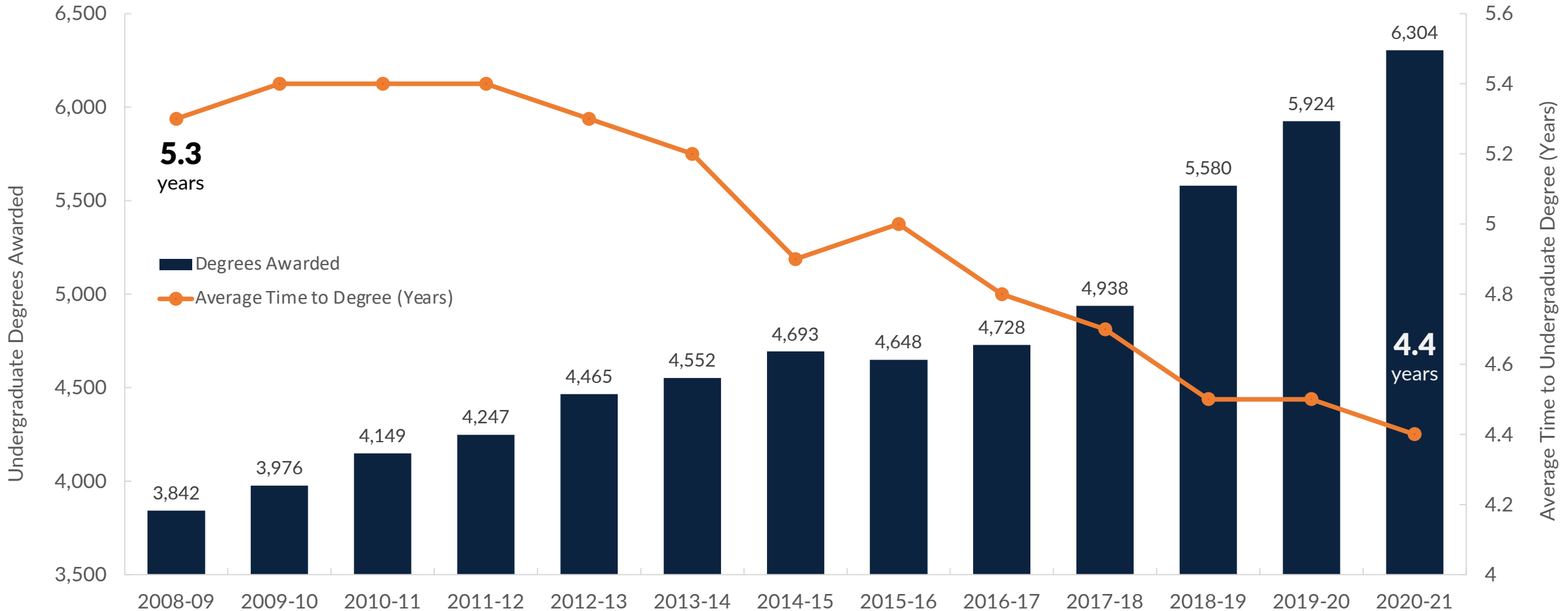
A Model for Student Success

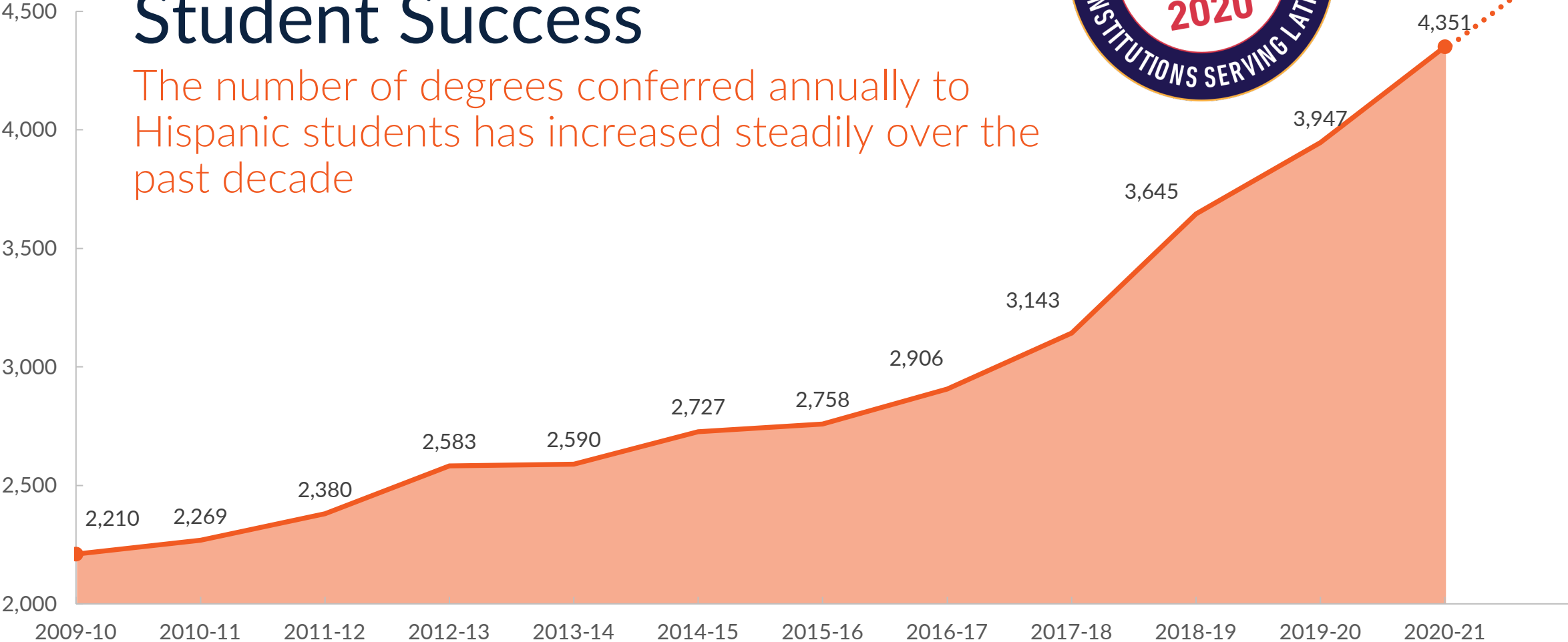
Undergraduate Degrees Awarded & Time to Degree

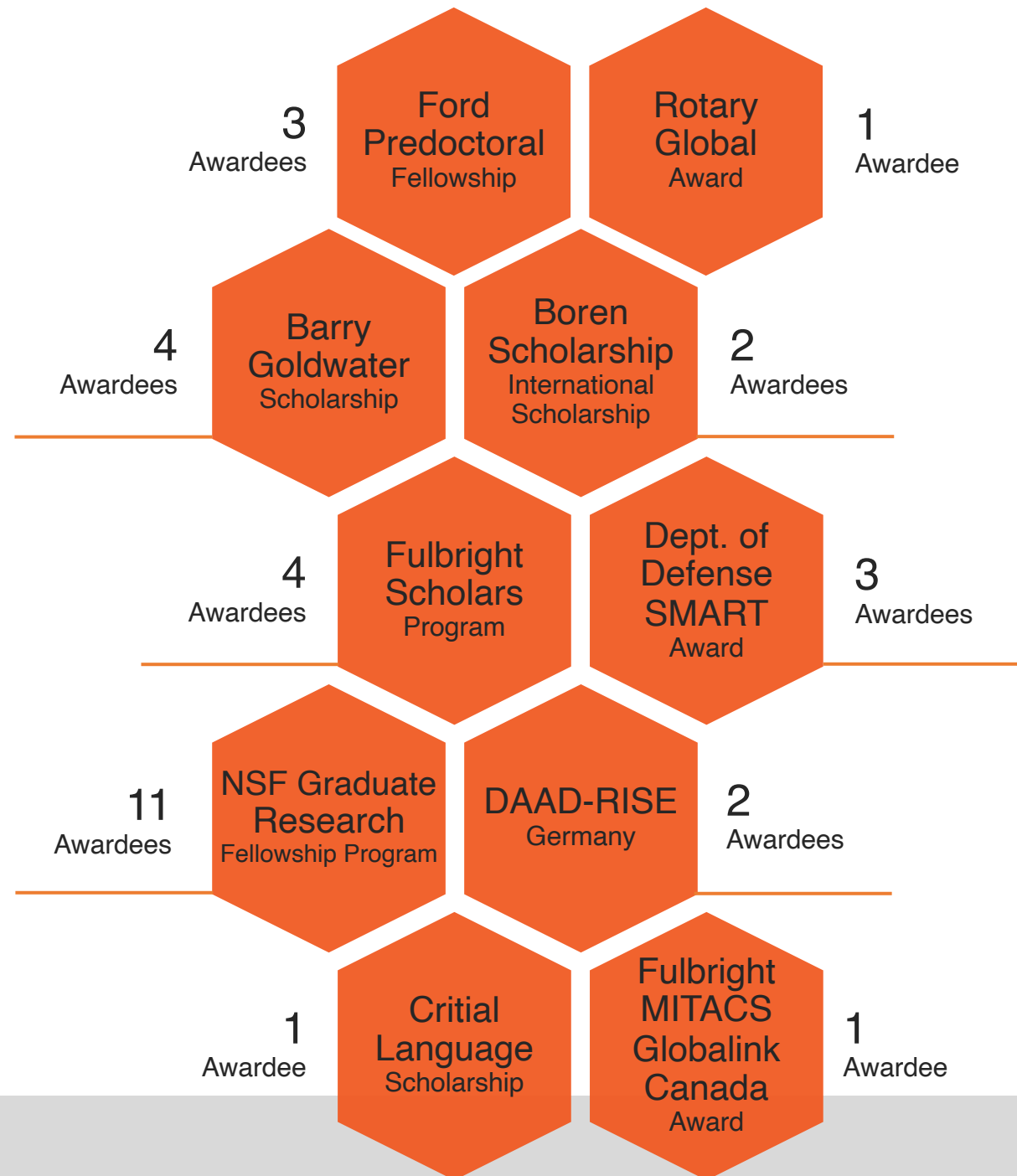

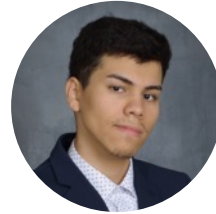

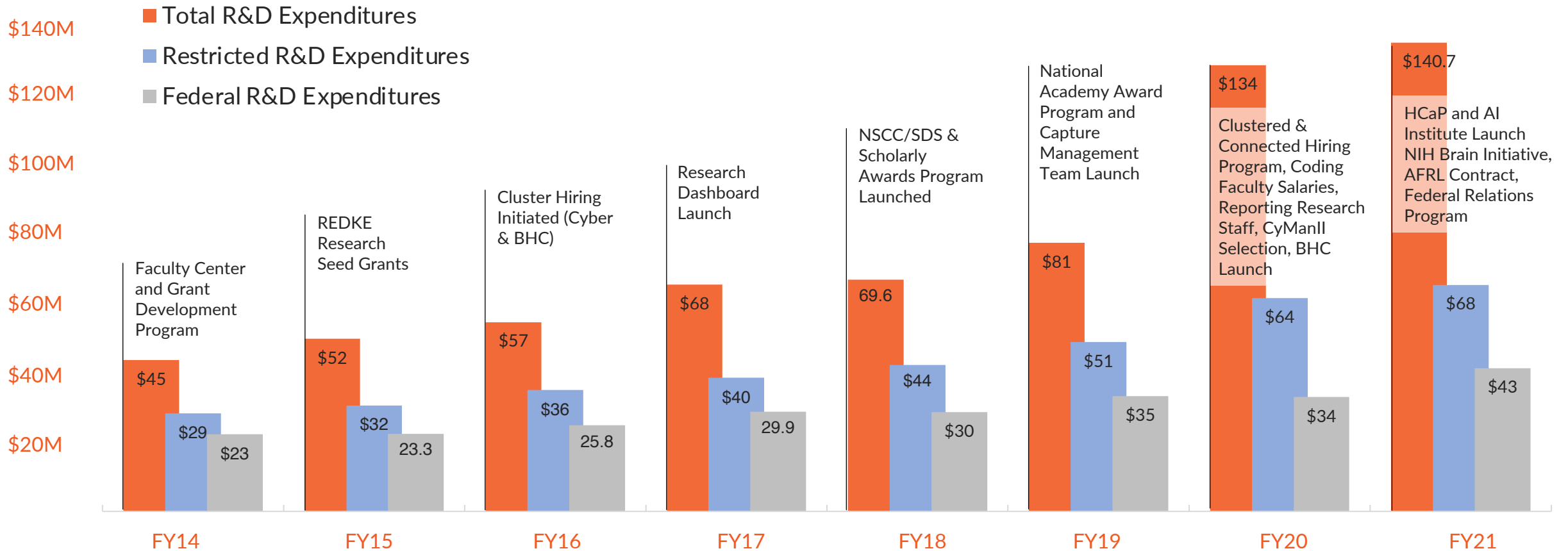


UTSA's Planned Trajectory

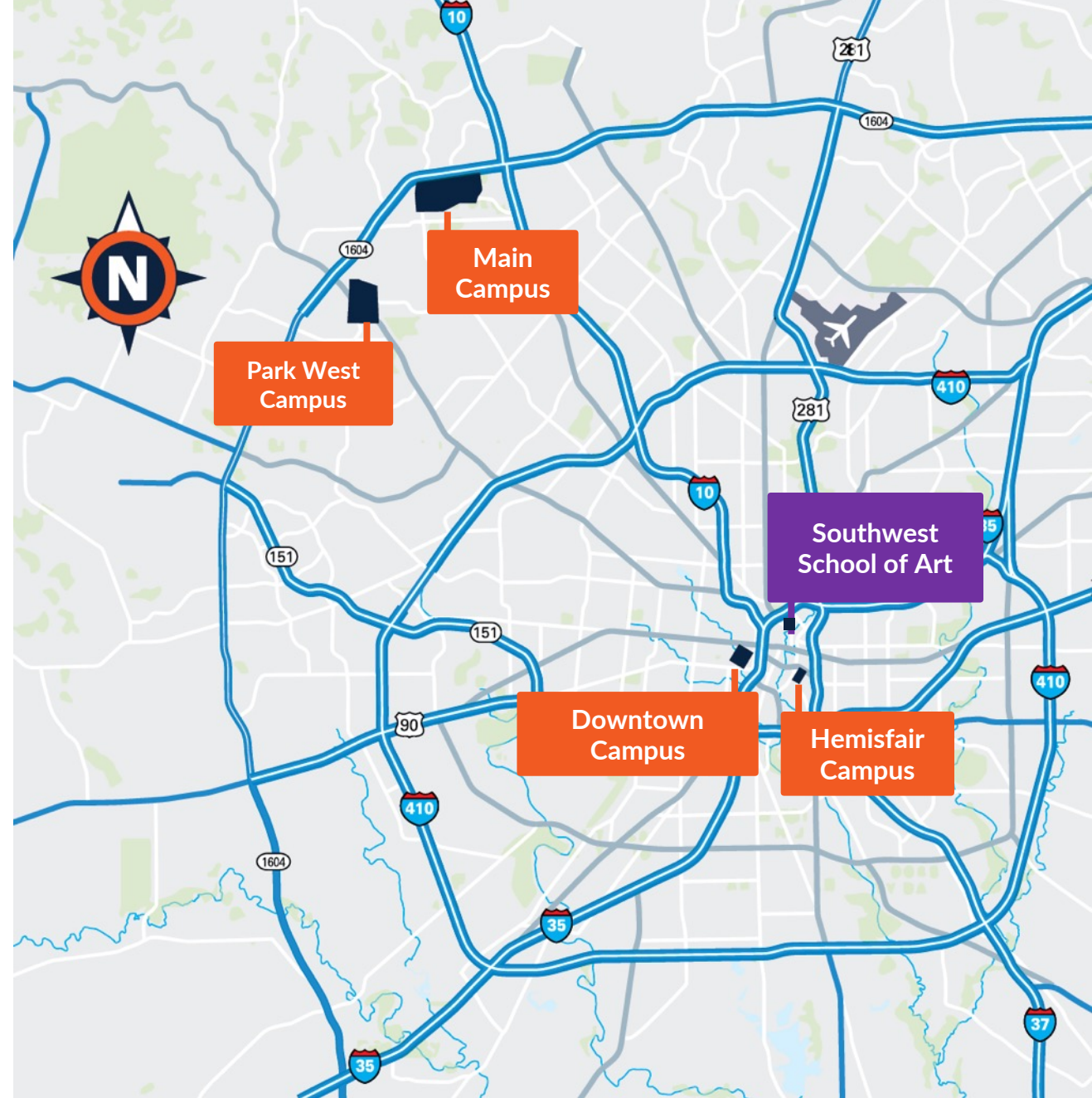
