## **Consent Agenda - APPROVED**

Approval of Minutes – January 23, 2025

### CHAIR'S REPORT: Alexis Godet

- An update was provided regarding the Faculty Advisory Council meeting in Austin on January 30 and 31, which included updates from system leadership. The UT System continues to maintain stable faculty recruitment numbers, potentially attributed to current funding and enrollment figures across the state.
  - System-wide analysis of the institutional funding stability was conducted with decision-making authority delegated to individual universities.
- Additionally, Provost Shipley has completed meetings with all college senators and deans.
- The well-being listening sessions were held last month at Main Campus and Downtown Campus. A Brand Socialization listening session also took place last month.
- The March senate meeting will be conducted in person.



# **Leadership Update Heather Shipley, Ph.D.,** *Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs*

- The provost acknowledged the current ambiguity surrounding federal grants. As we await decisions from the current legislative session, she is continuing discussions with stakeholders including the Senate, Department Chairs, Deans and UT System.
- The university administration is working along with UT System through government relationships to better
  understand legislative developments on both the House and Senate sides. At the federal level, work
  continues with UT System to communicate the significance of research initiatives and their impact on
  workforce development, student success and community engagement.
  - While uncertainty remains at present, leadership is committed to providing updates as new information becomes available.



### Has there been any communication sent from university leadership to address current concerns?

• Communications have been sent from the Research Office regarding federal-level actions, and information has been shared through Deans and other university leadership channels.

### Is UTSA developing contingency plans for potential impacts to federal grants?

• Data is being collected, and model scenarios will be developed, so next steps can be considered.

### What reassurance can be offered regarding the Department of Education letter from February 14?

• Jason King responded that the letter contained a statement from the Department of Education regarding their view on existing law. Following discussions with the UT System this week, we understand they are seeking further clarification and working with all institutions. As no specific deadline was mentioned in the letter, they are awaiting the conclusion of the legislative session to provide additional guidance.



Leadership Update

- An update on the 89th legislative session was provided. Senators were given an overview of institutional and employee rights and responsibilities regarding legislative activities, including state law and Regents' rules pertaining to faculty involvement in legislative matters.
- UTSA faculty may interact with the legislative process as private citizens. However, state employees cannot use state resources, email, funds, etc., for such activities.
- A review of key dates and processes for the current legislative session was provided. Due to the nature of the legislative process and pending bill reviews, there is limited preparation that can be done at this time.
- An overview of the legislative landscape and priorities for this session was presented. Updates on legislation
  can be tracked online where individuals can select bills of interest to receive real-time updates and alerts
  through the official Texas capitol website.
- The Office of the President ensures the tracking of bills relevant to UTSA and maintains in-person representation in Austin to monitor proceedings.
  - All slides and presentations are available on the Senate's SharePoint site.



Are there opportunities for faculty to contribute to discussions of the value of higher education and ongoing changes?

• Yes, we actively seek subject-matter experts to speak to the media and collaborate with our network.

Can faculty members write op-eds based on their professional expertise to inform the public?

 Yes, faculty members and groups of faculty can write op-eds about matters of public concern. However, they must clearly state the capacity under which they are writing and that they are not writing on behalf of UTSA—not doing so can be a violation. It is permissible, when you have clearly clarified your capacity as a private citizen. Additionally, faculty should not use institutional email, letterhead or other university resources when writing such pieces.

# **Secretary of the General Faculty Report Marie Tillyer,** *Chair*

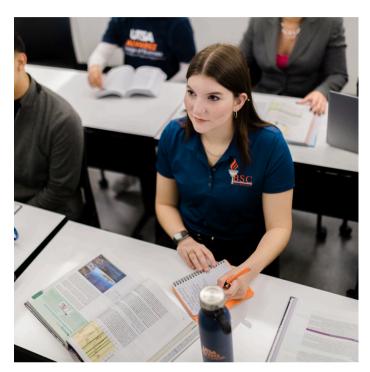
- An update was provided regarding upcoming elections. Senators serve for a three-year term and may be re-elected. Units that need to hold elections for the next academic year will receive email notifications.
