UTSA Campus Construction History

MAIN CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION

North Paseo Building (opened in 2014)

- Cost: \$52,000,000
- Five floors/180,050 square feet
- Includes laboratories, classrooms and most of UTSA's cybersecurity program

Malu and Carlos Alvarez Residence Hall (2013)

- Cost: \$43,500,000
- Four floors/187,300 square feet
- Houses 618 students living on campus

Park West Athletics Complex Phase I (2013)

- Cost: \$23,500,000
- 125 acres
- Home to UTSA's soccer stadium and track and field complex

Bauerle Road Garage (2012)

- Cost: \$40,000,000
- Six floors/438,236 square feet
- Ground floor includes Welcome Center, Scholarship office, Katz Alumni Center

Graduate School and Research Building (2011)

- Cost: \$15,000,000
- Two floors/75,327 square feet
- Houses UTSA Graduate School, Air Force and Army ROTC, research administration offices

Applied Engineering and Technology Building (2009)

- Cost: \$82,500,000
- Four floors/145,440 square feet
- STEM laboratories and classrooms

H-E-B University Center (2008)

- Cost: \$33,300,000
- Two floors/59,078 square feet
- Extension to University Center North for student groups and support services, conference space

Ximenes Ave. Garage (2008)

- Cost: \$30,025,000
- Four floors/188,041 square feet

Laurel Village (two phases, 2007 and 2008)

- Cost: \$39,272,000
- 12 buildings, 1-3 stories/253,016 square feet
- Houses 678 students living on campus

Tobin Ave. Garage (2005)

- Cost: \$9,450,000
- Two floors/202,635 square feet

Roadrunner Café (2005)

- Cost: \$12,000,000
- One floor/23,497 square feet
- Dining center for campus residents and visitors

Biotechnology, Sciences and Engineering Building (2005)

- Cost: \$83,700,000
- Five floors/221,440 square feet
- Includes STEM laboratories and classrooms, and many of UTSA's science cores

Margaret Batts Tobin Building (2005)

- Cost: \$10,600,000
- One floor/22,000 square feet
- Science laboratories

Chaparral Village (2004)

- Cost: \$36,601,467
- 17 buildings/349,272 square feet
- Houses 1,002 students living on campus

Main Building (2004)

- Cost: \$52,332,154
- Four floors/219,000 square feet
- Education research and classroom space, administrative offices

Recreation Wellness Center (2002)

- Cost: \$51,623,430
- Two floors/193,303 square feet
- Student recreation and fitness facility

Child Development Center (2002)

- Cost: \$2,900,000
- One floor/11,721 square feet
- Teaching and care facility, infants to age 5

Biosciences Building (1997)

- Cost: \$10,813,328
- Three floors/58,426 square feet
- Biology laboratories and classrooms

Business Building (1996)

- Cost: \$23,000,000
- Four floors/204,780 square feet
- Business research and classroom space

Engineering Building (1990)

- Cost: \$9,261,016
- Three floors/69,037 square feet
- Engineering laboratories and classrooms

University Center North (1986)

- Cost: \$14,373,174
- Two floors/140,794 square feet
- University services, bookstore, food court, student meeting space

Multidisciplinary Studies Building (1980)

- Cost: \$12,099,138
- Four floors/168,124 square feet
- Honors College, Consortium for Social Transformation, liberal arts classrooms and offices

John Peace Library (1976)

- Cost: \$11,051,047
- Four floors/225,891 square feet
- Library, study space, food court, One Stop Enrollment Center, Fiscal Services

McKinney Humanities Building (1975)

- Cost: \$7,942,203
- Four floors/180,850 square feet
- Liberal arts classrooms and offices

Arts Building (1975)

- Cost: \$10,643,617
- Four floors/125,967 square feet
- Fine arts classrooms, studios and performance spaces

Flawn Sciences Building (1975)

- Cost: \$11,020,688
- Four floors/185,362 square feet
- STEM laboratories and classrooms

Science Research Laboratories (opened in 1975, renovated in 2010)

- Cost: \$25,510,719
- One floor/30,695 square feet
- Science laboratories

Convocation Center (1975)

- Cost: \$4,315,418
- Two floors/72,614 square feet
- Sporting venue

Bosque Street Building (1974)

- Cost: \$1,325,633
- Two floors/27,890 square feet
- UTSA Police Department, Office of Information Technology

Durango Building (opened in 2001, addition in 2003)

- Cost: \$30,736,686
- Five floors/158,768 square feet
- Institute of Economic Development; Counseling, Educational Psychology, Criminal Justice and Public Administration research, classroom and office space

Downtown Campus Parking Garage (2001)

- Cost: \$5,865,638
- Four floors/139,900 square feet

Buena Vista Street Building (1999)

- Cost: \$21,346,421
- Five floors/145,517 square feet
- Arts theater, library, and research, classroom and meeting space

Frio Street Building (1997)

- Cost: \$32,000,000
- Five floors/112,546 square feet
- Education and Social Work research and classroom space

Monterey Building (1985)

- Cost: \$8,200,000
- Four floors/100,160 square feet
- Research, studio and classroom space for Demography, UTSA Mexico Center, and Architecture, Construction and Planning
